The papers of Winfred G. Allen, Jr. were placed by him in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in January, 1978 and were opened for research in November of 1981.

Mr. Allen, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Speech at Ambassador College, Pasadena, California received his doctorate from the University of California Los Angeles in June, 1977. His papers consist primarily of correspondence relating to his dissertation research on Eugene Debs, Daniel DeLeon, and William Haywood with emphasis on the speeches of the latter. In addition to the correspondence there are related materials such as bibliographies, transcripts of interviews, and reprints of articles and archival materials germane to his research.
