The idea for the Educational Project for Implementing Change (EPIC) began during the annual College Conference at Northland Inn in Southfield, in May of 1970. An interested group of students and faculty of the College of Education from this meeting continued to work together through the summer exploring the possibility of a teacher education program that would 1) explore and develop alternative and innovative models for more relevant teacher education, 2) more directly involve students in this process, and 3) recognize the direct relationship of teacher education to the problems and issues of public education in a changing society.

In the fall of 1970 a pre-program was initiated to develop a two-year experimental, interdisciplinary internship program leading to elementary and secondary certification and meeting the above needs. In May of 1971, an implementing team with six members was started and the possibilities were considered at a Student Ad Hoc meeting. In June several committees were formed and EPIC was underway. In the Fall term students in EPIC had three classes-3015, a secondary field study, and an elementary field study. During this term the people in EPIC also drew up a two year model program and presented it to the Dean.
